BOARD AND GENERAL MEETING MINUTES AND HIGHLIGHTS

The TLS Board met on March 4, 2020 at 7:30 p.m. at the TLS Education Center in Brookhaven. The minutes of the February 2020 Board Meeting were approved as distributed.

Treasurer's Report

The February balance sheet and transaction report were approved as distributed. The latest building assessment has been received from the county. A new water meter has been installed. Frank Warner reported that the dues cycle is closed. Three members passed away and 10 dropped, for a total of 157 voting members, 1 junior member, and 13 auxiliaries.

Committee Reports

Membership: Stacey Segal reported there are no new membership applications.

Community Programs: Linda Green reported that Christy Potter is contacting Boy Scout organizations to help with the loading/unloading of the Gemarama truck. Ken Dahl will also communicate with boy scout troops in Delaware and Montgomery Counties.

Programs: Rick Hellman will contact John O'Hara for making a presentation about snuff bottles at the April General meeting. The May meeting program is to be announced. A discussion ensued about the need for members to volunteer to make presentations and/or create alternative programs such as "Name That Rock Night" and interactive games with mineralogical/lapidary themes.

Education Center/Facilities & Equipment: John Chickadel will arrange maintenance on the air conditioning and heat systems at the appropriate times of the year and will address the leaking bathroom faucets. Don Schwarzkopf reports that an electrician needs to be hired to finish the electrical issues.

Library and eBay: Stacey Segal reports that two new books have been added to the library: Jaspers, Agates from the California Coast Ranges by Hans Gamma and Die-Forming for Jewelers & Metalsmiths by Susan Kingsley.

Gemarama: Barry Messino showed a copy of the new flyer and said all dealer letters have been sent.

Old Business: Lisa Laffend said that TLS events will be listed on the DCAC events calendar by the end of May. Pete Santucci gave information about the TLS scholarship to be presented to a student at Sun Valley High School at the school dinner/ball on Thursday, June 4. Frank Warner will send a check to the school Scholarship Fund. Frank also talked about the Dropbox App as a good way for TLS to meet the legal requirements for record keeping as a corporation. TLS Archive will be maintained long term. Once a year, Lisa Laffend, archivist, will move important documents from Dropbox folders into the ARCHIVE folder. Lisa, Ken Dahl and Frank Warner will be editors. The Board approved the purchase of a Geiger Counter for the Ed Center.

New Business: An Executive Committee plus will be formed to address Coronavirus issues. Linda Green is researching a company that recycles precious metals from trash, old pieces of sandpaper, etc. The company will be contacted.



The General Meeting was held Wednesday, March 11. Committee reports and other items discussed at the Board Meeting were presented. Minutes were approved from the last meeting.

Linda Green reported the sad news that member Merrill E. Dickinson, Sr. passed away on February 27, 2020. His daughter, Laura, was in attendance at this meeting and donated items for the silent auction.

Frank Warner reported that the membership dues cycle is closed and TLS finances are strong.

Rick Hellman reported that it is difficult to get volunteers to present programs. John Chickadel, Jody Shaw and Rick Hellman will look into the development of interactive mineralogical/lapidary themed games for future meetings.

John Chickadel announced that the bathroom has a new faucet installed by Frank Warner and Doug Klieger. Don Schwarzkopf announced that an electrician will be at the Ed Center on Friday to look at the distribution panel. Volunteers are requested to help install conduit.

Stacey Segal reported 30 books have been listed for sale on eBay.

Linda Lakitsky reported that contract letters have been sent to vendors. Linda was presented with a "Thank You" plaque for her continued work as committee chair.

Lisa Laffend reported that members should check the delcoarts.org website for event updates. Peter Santucci Jr. will present the TLS Scholarship check to the Penn-Delco School District for a Sun Valley High School senior. Steve Hansen said that he is looking for an Opal carver for Fall classes. The Board approved the purchase of a Geiger Counter for the Ed Center

Each division offers three levels you can achieve. Apprentice, Journeyman, and Master. Each is more challenging than the previous and a great way to build and demonstrate your growing lapidary skills. And remember, any work you submit is anonymous, and is judged by a knowledgeable member of TLS based only on the requirements needed to meet the level of skill you are attempting. Any feedback is designed only to help you improve your skills as you move to higher levels. If you find yourself at home now with more time on your hands; this might be the perfect time to pick out a project that meets the Skip Manual requirements. ****CHANGES TO THE SPRING TERM
SCHEDULE****

Our top priority is the health and well-being of all members and students of the TLS Community. Ultimately it may be the case that we will need to cancel the entire spring term in response to the coronavirus pandemic. We have decided to make those decisions in monthly steps with full consideration of all local, state and national health advisories. Since the statements below for May and June are simplest, they occur first, followed by details of what is happening with April courses.

June

Decisions as to whether or not it would be safe and appropriate to hold classes, workshops, or open shop sessions scheduled for June will be made by mid-May.

May

Decisions as to whether or not it would be safe and appropriate to hold classes, workshops, or open shop sessions scheduled for May, or to begin in May, will be made by mid-April.

April

All classes scheduled for April, or to begin in April, are cancelled with the following few exceptions:

Five-week versions of the following courses will begin late May or early June, if social distancing requirements have been dropped and if it is deemed safe and appropriate to do so. That decision will be made late-April. Students in the courses that were originally 10 weeks long will be refunded the difference in tuition between a 10-week and a 5-week course after the

decision is made regarding the 5-week versions. Students can drop now if they prefer.

Here are descriptions of competitions, judging, and award. AFMS Uniform Rules will not be used in the evaluation of cases and the selection of awards. Material selection, craftsmanship, presentation, and showmanship are the key factors.

GROUND RULES FOR EXHIBITORS & AWARD SELECTION

JUDGING: Judging will take place prior to the opening of the show on Saturday; identifying labels will be added to the cases when judging is complete.

AWARD SELECTION: A committee of judges will evaluate all cases and select winners of the four category awards:

- *Most Educational-(All educational exhibits are eligible.)
*Best Theme Display-"Pictures in Stone" (All exhibits of theme material are eligible.)
*Best Non-Member Display-(Cases by non-TLS members only are eligible.)
*Best Small Case-18" x 12" (Cases by TLS members only are eligible.)

Judging committee will select cases for Best in Show and Director's Award.

ELIGIBILITY FOR AWARDS: An exhibitor may win only one of the four category awards. All cases, including winners of category awards are eligible for Best in Show or Director's Award. An exhibitor cannot receive an identical award two years in a row. For example, the winner in 2019 of the Educational Award is not eligible for the Education Award in 2020. Certain TLS exhibits are not eligible for awards (Single Stone exhibition, Education Center display, Memorial cases, Intarsias, etc.).
