BOARD & GENERAL MEETING MINUTES AND HIGHLIGHTS

The TLS Board met at 7:30 p.m. on Wednesday, December 4 at the TLS Education Center in Brookhaven. The minutes of the November meeting were approved as distributed as was the Treasurer’s report, which included the November balance sheet and transaction report. Frank Warner said that dues are coming in, primarily through PayPal, and the next email notice will come out after the General Meeting.

Committee Reports:

Membership: Linda Green presented three new membership applications for Christina Griffin, Amy Nemirow, and Valerie Weist. All three applications were unanimously approved.

Programs: The January and February programs are yet to be determined. A few ideas for topics and speakers were generated during the subsequent discussion.

Education/Classes/Registrar: Bill Frampton said that the winter session registration is going very well, with some classes filling quickly. The beginning silver class has a long wait list.

Education Center/Facilities & Equipment: Pete Santucci said that the HVAC system was inspected and all is well. Pete thanked John Chickadel for agreeing to take on the role of Ed Center Director. Anthony Lombardo agreed to make the award plaques. Pete will continue to keep an eye on the building and to take care of keys for the building. Pete also said that he sanded and varnished some burn marks in the jewelry studio and repaired the spring on the instructor shelf drawer. The Board unanimously thanked Pete for his service as Ed Center Director. Frank Warner said that there were two open torch sessions scheduled for December, and after confirmation that there were no other plans for the jewelry studio between those

weekends, said that the glass torches will be left in place. He also said that the quick connects were getting more difficult to use and that he has bought replacements, partially paid for by a generous donation from Christina Kulp. The new quick connects will be installed before winter session classes begin. Frank also said that he bought a replacement part for the Hoover vacuum, which he would repair tomorrow. The large slab saw is out of order. Linda Green said that the handle on the disc cutter in the jewelry studio was broken. She bought a replacement handle, but also saw that a Pepe disc cutter, which does not have a handle, was on sale on Cyber Monday, and purchased it for TLS. John Chickadel said that the next clean-up day will be on Saturday, January 4, 2020, from 9 a.m.-12 p.m.

Gemarama: Linda Lakitsky said the next Gemarama meeting will be held on January 22, 2019, at 7:30 p.m. at the Ed Center, to discuss social media and volunteers.

Old Business: Steve Hansen said that Kieu Pham Gray’s classes are filling well and he is working on a list of assistants to help. Steve also said that he has finalized a schedule for Jeff Fulkerson to visit in June for workshops which will include three days for construction of an inlay pendant and one day for silversmithing.

New Business: Frank Warner presented a draft budget for 2020 and asked that the Board review it for a vote in January 2020. There was some discussion in general about how the numbers are generated. Frank also shared a summary of the numbers of enrollments and income from tuition over the last five years.

Linda Green asked for volunteers to bring cold drinks, table covers, and paper products for the holiday party next week. Linda also said to note the dates for January meetings, because New Year’s Day will fall on Wednesday this year.



The General Meeting was held on Wednesday, December 11. Committee reports and other items discussed at the Board Meeting were presented. Frank Warner said that 2020 dues are due by the end of December, and the easiest way to pay is to follow the link in the Mail Chimp email and pay with PayPal. A PayPal account is not required—our

system will take a credit card at the PayPal stage. Members may also use the form that comes in the Bulletin and pay by check if they prefer. The next dues email will come this week. Frank reported on the account balances and said that Gemarama was within about \$25 of the budget and silent auction payments continue to come in.

Frank also said that he presented a draft 2020 budget at the Board meeting and shared a summary of the numbers of enrollments and tuition income (tuition minus instructor fees), which have risen substantially over the past 5 years, thanks to Kathy Hobson’s work as class manager.

Bill Frampton said that registration for the winter session is going well. He asked that members remember to return to the site after paying with PayPal to complete registration. He also asked members to click the “proceed” button only once, to prevent registering twice for a class.

John Chickadel was appointed by the Board to be the Ed Center Director. John said that a classroom clean-up day will be held on Saturday, January 4, from 9 a.m.-12 p.m. and all are welcome to help out. Don Schwarzkopf said that he is working on fixing the large slab saw.

Linda Green said that a report-out meeting for Gemarama was held last month, and that the next meeting is scheduled for Wednesday, January 22, at 7:30 p.m. at the Ed Center to discuss social media and other topics.

Gene presented an award to Stacey Segal as Master in the Constructed Jewelry division. Congratulations to Stacey!

Steve Hansen said that Kieu Pham Gray will be a visiting instructor in January for six workshops. Jeff Fulkerson will return for workshops in June, with three days for inlay and one day for silversmithing. Linda thanked outgoing Board members Pete Santucci (Ed Center Director) and Lisa Laffend (Recording Secretary). She also thanked outgoing Bulletin Editor Pam Wingrod and (not out-going) Gemarama Chair Linda Lakitsky.

Linda said that Cindy Duncan has resigned as the Education Chair for health reasons, and asked for a volunteer to fill that position. Please contact Linda for more information. Frank Warner said that Cindy was responsible for bringing Main Line

School Night classes to TLS, which has been very beneficial, particularly in bringing in new members. The program was a beautifully presented and delicious array of treats and wonderful conversation among the members and guests in celebration of the holiday season.

TLS DROPBOX FOR ALL MEMBERS

All Tuscarora Lapidary Society members can have access to the **TLS Folder** on Dropbox (a 'cloud' storage service) through a password-protected link. **TLS Folder** contains past Bulletins, the TLS History Booklet, the current membership list, the TLS Policy & Procedure Manual, the TLS by-laws, and the SKIP Manual, as well as the current TLS phone tree. No special software is required. The **TLS Folder** can be accessed by clicking [HERE](#). Once you click on the link, you will be asked for a password. Contact me for that password. Once you have reached **TLS Folder**, you can view the contents in your browser. You can also download files to your computer, but note that downloaded files are disconnected from the Dropbox and will not receive periodic updates. For the most recent versions, always go through the link to the **TLS Folder** Dropbox. There are separate password-protected links to other Dropboxes. **TLS Board** is for the Board and various committee chairs, and **TLS Classes** is for our registrars, class manager, and teachers. In addition, we also have a Dropbox called **TLS Public**. This is a place where we can post information for our students, accessed through the following link, which does not require a password. Currently, this Dropbox contains two folders. One is called "Faceting" and contains information useful for faceting students, including references, patterns, and lecture notes. Another folder, called "Glass" contains useful references for students in lampworking, fusing, and pâte de verre classes. The link to **TLS Public** can be accessed by clicking [HERE](#). PRESENTATION FOR THE TLS GENERAL MEETING JANUARY 15, 2020

“Mineral, Gem and Rock Collecting in a Former Mining Region: Michigan’s Keweenaw Peninsula”

The Upper Peninsula is a spectacular locality for rock and gem collectors, as more than 150 collectible rocks and minerals are scattered along the beaches of Michigan’s Upper Peninsula. As many as twenty different kinds of minerals can sometimes be identified within a given area. The Keweenaw Peninsula is at the heart of the best mineral collecting grounds in the North Central States of the U.S., with the rainbow colors of Lake Superior agates distributed all along the Lake’s shores, and with banded agates in the Eastern Upper Peninsula. Jasper, quartz, native copper, datolite and pearly pink thompsonite may be found in discarded rock piles of abandoned mines near Rockland and Mass, with manganite derived from L’Anse and bubbly black psilomelane originating from the Ironwood area. Greenstones (chlorastrolite), usually light to dark green or blue green in a turtleback pattern are found in the Keweenaw Peninsula and along the shores of Isle Royale. The largest outcropping of jasper in the U.S. can be found in Ishpeming, with specular hematite, quartz, tourmaline and other minerals found near Champion and elsewhere. The Precambrian rocks west of Marquette are the ancient granites, the iron formations and the copper-bearing rocks. Ken will discuss mineral and rock collecting opportunities of the western portion of the Upper Peninsula of Michigan.
