PRESENTATION FOR THE TLS GENERAL MEETING MARCH 11, 2020

We will be holding one of our two annual Silent Auctions taking place immediately after the conclusion of our TLS Business Meeting on March 12th, 2020. Always popular, make sure to show up early to check out all of the available items up for bid!

HOW DOES THE SILENT AUCTION WORK?

First, bring something you wish to donate to the Club: rough, slabs, cabs, cut stones, findings, finished jewelry, equipment, tools, supplies, books, or whatever (not junk). Fill out one of the auction forms on page 8 for each item. (If you don't know what to put down for the price, leave it blank; help will be available at the meeting.) If you have more than three items to donate, copy the auction forms; there also will be extra forms at the meeting. Please remember, while you can check things out ahead of time, the Silent Auction begins only <u>after</u> the General Meeting is adjourned.

How does it work? When you choose what you want, write your name and your bid on the item's slip. Your bid must be just one increment over the last bid. If someone 'ups' your bid, fill in your next offer. When the table is closed, the last name on the list (the highest bid) gets to purchase the item for that bid.

BOARD AND GENERAL MEETING MINUTES AND HIGHLIGHTS

The TLS Board met on February 5, 2020 at 7:30 p.m. at the TLS Education Center in Brookhaven. The minutes of the January 2020 Board Meeting were approved as distributed.

Treasurer's Report

The Treasurer's Report was sent to Board Members. There were no questions. Discussion ensued about the members with unpaid dues. February 15 was the last day to pay dues.

Committee Reports

Membership: Stacey Segal reported there are no new membership applications.

Community Programs: Christy Potter reported that she is working to find youth groups who can help pack up/unload the Gemarama truck in Brookhaven and Oaks. Linda Green stated that the Delaware Mineralogical Society Show is in March and John Chickadel has been asked to demonstrate cabbing. The white Gemarama tickets will be available for distribution at that show.

<u>Programs:</u> A silent auction will be held at the March meeting. Topics for April and May are yet to be determined. John Chickadel stated that John O'Hara would like to give a presentation and talk about the restoration of snuff bottles. Frank Warner said that Rick Hellman suggested an external speaker whom he would like to invite for a program about a quarry he owns in New York State.

Education Center/Facilities & Equipment: Linda Green stated that John Chickadel and others have been removing the trash and recycling from the Center. In an effort to share this responsibility with members, Linda will write an article for the Bulletin encouraging others to pitch in and remove trash and recycling. Kathy Hobson, in her letter to teachers, will include the message, "Teachers, if you notice the bins are full, could you ask students to take it home?" Discussion ensued about how to reduce waste.

Stacey Segal said that 14,000 diamond paste is needed. Frank Warner said he would order it. There was a discussion about Education Center keys, new plaques being made, HVAC inspections, and the need to check the mail regularly.

<u>Library and eBay:</u> Stacey Segal noted that several boxes of books, not yet sorted, have been donated to TLS. Machinery will be available at

the Spring Silent Auction. If unsold, they will be put on eBay. Kieu Pham Gray donated her latest book, <u>Minimal Metal Jewelry</u>, published by Kalmbach Media, to the TLS library.

Gemarama: Linda Lakitsky reported that she and Anna Thompson are working on a plan for social media to promote Gemarama. Per a vendor request, one floor plan change has been made. Further changes will be discussed only if openings occur. Negotiations with Kieu Pham Gray continue regarding classes/vendor space at the next Gemarama. In addition to established ways of recruiting volunteers, Lisa Laffend has found some easy software for member use in order to sign up for volunteer tasks. The next Gemarama meeting will be on March 18. Volunteers are welcome.

New Business: Lisa Laffend reported that the Delaware County Arts Consortium met and discussed Arts Advocacy and Pennsylvania Arts Advocacy Days and how to approach elected officials for support. Lisa suggested that we consider attending the Brookhaven and Springfield Township meetings to introduce ourselves and look for opportunities for mutual support and community involvement.

Linda Green and Anna Thompson have been working on Facebook and Instagram postings. Discussion ensued about the effectiveness and cost of system packages for increasing TLS social media.

A miniature jeweler's bench, created by Marthe Roberts/Shea was presented to Peter Santucci, Jr. for his role as Education Center Director 2011 – 2019. (See pictures page 3.)

Linda Lakitsky said that Mimi Favre would like to bring a group of jewelers to tour TLS and try their hands at cabbing from pre-forms. She hopes that may generate an interest in cabbing and potentially bring in new members.

The June Banquet will be held at Charlotte's restaurant, Newtown Square, on June 10. The next general meeting will be on Wednesday, March 11.

The General Meeting was held Wednesday, February 12. Committee reports and other items discussed at the Board Meeting were presented.

Linda Green, President, reported that Peter Santucci, Jr. was pleased with the TLS gift he received. Linda also reported that member Merrill Dickinson is very ill. He is at home, on

Hospice, and his daughters are with him.

Frank Warner, treasurer, reported that TLS finances are strong. We are expecting the receipt of a few more membership dues.

Linda Green reported that trash, recycling and taking a "greener" approach to consumption was discussed at the Board meeting. Frank Warner explained TLS would be required to have a "commercial" account to have trash pick-up. A dumpster would be placed in the parking lot, leaving no space for cars. As a result, TLS depends on members to volunteer to take the trash home with them for disposal.

Linda Green reported that the last Gemarama meeting agenda focused on publicity and vendor issues. Contracts will be mailed soon. Members will visit a few gem and mineral shows looking for prospective vendors.

Lisa Laffend reported that Delco Arts Week is on the calendar for September. Some TLS events are listed on their website, <u>delcoarts.org.</u>, as well as the Philly Fun Guide.

Anna Thompson and Linda Green are researching software to facilitate posting to Instagram and Facebook. Possibly Mailchimp will be used.

An audit of the 2019 financial records will take place March 25 at the Education Center.

Member Rick Hellman presented the film "Opals of Australia" Documentary by Patrick Voillot. This was an interesting history of the Opal in Australia. Rick also exhibited an opal belemnite (squid) and showed photos from his collection of gem dinosaur bones and pyritized fossils.

Kieu Pham Gray kindly donated her latest book, "Minimal Metal Jewelry", to the TLS library. "Minimal" is only applicable to the materials. With only two gauges of wire and two sizes of jump rings, there are detailed instructions for 21 projects including chains, earrings, pendants, and rings. By expanding materials to other metals, literally hundreds of variations are possible. In addition to the designs, there's a "basics" section on tools, materials and a detailed section on nine different techniques. There is lots of fun for both the beginner and advanced metalsmith. SPRING CLASSES BEGIN APRIL 4, 2020

TLS offers classes to adults interested in pursuing lapidary and jewelry arts. No previous experience is needed unless a prerequisite is noted. In some courses and workshops there is an additional charge for supplies and equipment. Pricing for classes is listed for members (M) and non-members (NM). Membership requires completion of Beginning Cabochon or Faceting class, participation in two TLS monthly meetings and willingness to participate as a volunteer in TLS activities. Course details, including the required supply and tool lists for many classes, and our registration system, may be found https://www.lapidary.org/classes-spring-2020. Fees for supplies are payable to the instructors, and may depend on the choice of materials.

REFUND POLICY: If you wish to withdraw from a class, workshop, or open shop session, you must notify the Registrar by phone or email. Payment will be refunded 100% if you withdraw before the course, workshop, or open shop session begins. For multi day courses (not workshops or open shop sessions), payment will be refunded 80% if you withdraw before the second class. No refunds are given after the second meeting of a multi-day course. No refunds are given after the first day of a multi-day workshop. No refunds are given for missed open shop sessions (Exception: Members may receive a 50% refund, if requested, after missing an open slab-saw session.)
