BOARD AND GENERAL MEETING MINUTES/HIGHLIGHTS

The Board Meeting was called to order on April 7 at 7:33 p.m. by Linda Green through ZOOM. The minutes of the March 3, 2021 Board Meeting and the March 10, 2021 General Meeting were approved as distributed.

<u>Announcements</u>: Linda Green stated that Christina Kulp has been in the hospital and rehabilitation. Linda also stated that the rising Pennsylvania COVID-19 cases will be monitored for the purpose of determining the safe scheduling of TLS classes and events.

Treasurer's Report: Ken Dahl distributed the March Transaction Report and Balance Sheet. The Transaction Report was later corrected through email to reflect net proceeds from the March 20 one-day sale of \$1,119.71. Cash on hand and total net outflow was presented. A check for the \$1,000 scholarship to be awarded to a student at Sun Valley High School was issued and received. TLS will be informed to whom it was awarded later this spring.

Committee Reports:

<u>Programs</u>: Linda Green reported that April's program will feature Michael Pabst, President of the Shenandoah Valley Gem and Mineral Society, who will make a presentation about microminerals and a tour of the Pyrenees.

<u>Membership</u>: Stacey Segal reported that she received a Membership Application from student Margaret Gandolfo, who is still working on the meeting attendance requirement.

<u>Class Manager</u>: Steve Hansen stated that spring classes are under way. He is canvassing for teachers for the summer term, which will be on a restricted schedule. Standard, full size classes are planned for the fall semester. Kieu Pham Gray is scheduled to teach in September.

Equipment & Facilities: Don Schwartzkopf reported that he has all the materials necessary to fix the jewelry bench compressed air system and will soon complete that upgrade. Library and eBay: Stacey Segal reported no library updates. She has books to list on eBay and was pleased to report that the two dendritic sandstone displays were sold and being shipped to a buyer in Wales, U.K.

Gemarama: Linda Lakitsky asked Mimi Favre to speak about vendors. Mimi has received a number of vendor contracts/checks, but a couple of spots are open. She is looking for a mineral dealer. Sheryl Dahl reported that Kieu Pham Gray has dropped out of teaching at Gemarama. A discussion ensued regarding the possibility of finding a guest instructor. Old Business: Linda Green reported that the March 20 oneday sale went well and netted over \$1000. A financial audit conducted through ZOOM on March 24 by Terry Fain and Joyce Babiarz concluded that the financial records accurately represent the position of TLS as of December 31, 2020. Regarding EFMLS, Linda stated that their most recent meeting was cancelled due to lack of a quorum. Linda Green and Sheryl Dahl stated the need for improved internet access in the Education Center, particularly in the jewelry room. Don Schwarzkopf will look into it and present options. The position of TLS Historian was created by the Board. Responsibilities of the Historian will be added to the Operations Manual. With the approval of the Board, Linda Green appointed Frank Warner as Historian.

New Business: Linda Green reported that Doug McNicol and Doug Klieger will make arrangements to sell remaining donated material at the Philadelphia Mineral Society's outdoor show on May 8 in Mont Clare, PA. Mimi Favre received permission to host a ZOOM meeting from the Education Center for the Philadelphia Chapter of the Women's Jewelry Association in July.

The General Meeting of April 14, 2021 by ZOOM was called to order at 7:31 p.m. by President Linda Green. In attendance were 28 members, 2 non-members, and the speaker. It was moved and seconded to approve the minutes of the March 3, 2021Board Meeting and the March 10, 2021 General Meeting. Committee reports and other items discussed at the Board Meeting were briefly presented.

Linda Green reported on the CDC Emergency Meeting Advisory Committee regarding COVID-19 vaccination status.

Frank Warner announced that he sent out a Mailchimp email to members regarding a memorial luncheon in May for Roger Binns.

This evening's program will feature Michael Pabst, President of the Shenandoah Valley Gem & Mineral Society and Treasurer of the Microminerologists of the National Capital Area, who will speak on "Mineral Hunting in the Pyrenees – A Virtual and Imaginary Tour". Kathy Lopez stated that next month's program will feature a video about the Hope Diamond. Kathy is soliciting information/photos of creative projects by members working at home during the COVID-19 restrictions to be shared at the June meeting.

Steve Hansen stated that both sessions of Main Line School Night are sold out. Spring term classes are moving forward. Summer and fall terms are in planning stage.

Bill Frampton stated that he will cancel classes with zero registrants. He said that those who wish to use slab saws should register and pay in advance. In rare cases in which an instructor or open shop supervisor allows slab saw use by someone who did not register, appropriate fees should be collected by the instructor or supervisor, and Bill should be notified so that he can update our registration records.

John Chickadel named and thanked the members who volunteered for the spring cleaning and equipment preparation on April 1. He has contacted a mason contractor to inspect some observed brick issues on the building exterior.

Don Schwarzkopf stated that he has all the material necessary to fix the jewelry bench compressed air system, and will soon make that upgrade.

Linda Lakitsky stated that she will have more vendor information next week and will schedule a brief meeting to discuss an instructor to replace Kieu Pham Gray. Rick Hellman will continue his role managing security for Gemarama.
