## TLS ED CENTER COVID-19 MASK POLICY

Based on the new CDC Covid-19 metrics, all of the counties in our region are currently at low or moderate community levels. Based on these levels, the CDC recommends the wearing of masks based on personal preference and individual risk factors. At the TLS Board meeting, it was decided that commensurate with the start of the Spring 2022 term (April 2), the TLS Ed Center Covid mask policy would change from masks required to masks recommended while in our facility.

Please note that the CDC metrics are dynamic and a mask requirement will be implemented if any of the counties in our region are determined to have high community Covid levels. Also, note that these guidelines are strictly related to Covid-19 transmission. Any safety related mask requirements based on course content and activities are not impacted.

## — From Janice Lawson, Recording Secretary BOARD AND GENERAL MEETING MINUTES/HIGHLIGHTS

The March 2 Board Meeting by Zoom was called to order at 7:30 p.m. by President Stacey Segal. The minutes of the February Board and General Meetings were approved as distributed.

<u>Announcements</u>: Stacey Segal shared that member Tina Brunner's father recently passed away. A condolence card will be sent.

Treasurer's Report: Ken Dahl reported on the February

### Committee Reports:

<u>Membership</u>: Gary Cummings presented one new member application for Robert M. Burt, with Bill Frampton and John Chickadel as his sponsors. Robert's membership was unanimously approved.

<u>Community Programs</u>: Linda Green attended the DCAC meeting. Activities are picking up and there is a need for more art and music teachers. Linda is going to explore using the DCAC and Visit Delco PA websites to market some TLS activities. <u>Education</u>: Lisa Laffend reported that the TLS calendar on the website is updated with Jewish holidays and she will add some additional religious holidays.

<u>Class Manager</u>: Steve Hansen said that registration for the Spring 2022 schedule is open and many classes are filled. There is some lagging in enrollment for the classes with invited guest instructors. Main Line School Night registration has been open and two people are signed up for each session; we need a minimum of three. A cabbing instructor may be needed for the course in early June. The Summer schedule is being developed for July and August. Please let Steve know of any interest in teaching. <u>Acquisitions</u>: Doug McNicol reported that he picked up an acquisition yesterday from member Nancy Irons, who donated some slabs and a few books.

<u>Library and eBay</u>: Stacey Segal reported that member Maxine Burkholder donated two books with great jewelry design inspiration. They will be added to the Library.

<u>By-Laws & Parliamentarian</u>: Gary Cummings stated that the information regarding building procedures and guidelines for teaching at the TLS Education Center has been sent to all class teachers.

<u>Gemarama</u>: Mimi Favre reported that all the vendor contracts are out either electronically or in the mail.

<u>SKIP</u>: Dennis Coren created a write up to encourage participation in SKIP. Dennis also asked instructors to encourage participation in SKIP during their classes. Dennis also announced there are two awards for Journeyman in Spheres to be presented at the next General Meeting, to John Chickadel and Barry Messino.

Old Business:

- •Stacey Segal stated that Kathy Hobson has secured the reservation at Charlotte's restaurant for Wednesday, June 8th. Kathy will work on details with menus, etc.
- •The TLS Audit will proceed with 2 approved members as auditors at the Ed Center.
- •A volunteer is still needed for the position of Ed Center Director.
- •It was approved by the Board to follow a "Masks
- Recommended" policy for TLS. A table will remain in the Ed Center with the sign in sheet, thermometer, masks and hand sanitizer. Effective date for this policy will be April 2, 2022. <u>New Business</u>:
- •Stacey reported that there was a request to use Paypal for class fees. Frank Warner stated that fees coming to TLS should be built into the tuition.
- •Ken Dahl proposed an Introduction to Chasing and Repoussé course for this fall, 6 seats in the first class. Equipment and tools

will be needed to use in class and would be stored at the Ed Center. Frank Warner made a motion to approve expenditures for this course and it was approved by the Board.

•Dennis Coren proposed the need for adding a second vulcanizing machine, frameplates, and thermometers to the Ed Center for the vulcanizing workshops. Stacey Segal made a motion to purchase one vulcanizing machine and the Board approved.



The March 9 General Meeting by Zoom was called to order at 7:32 p.m. by Vice President Gary Cummings. In attendance were 31 members and 9 guests. Gary Cummings welcomed all guests in attendance.

Committee and other items discussed at the Board Meeting were briefly presented.

- •Ken Dahl gave the financial report for February.
- •Kathy Lopez stated that she is working on the fall program schedule and that next month will be the silent auction. Gary Cummings added that the silent auction will be held at the Springfield Municipal Building. All members and guests are welcome to attend.
- •Gary Cummings stated that the spring clean up that takes place between winter and spring classes will occur Sunday, March 20th at the Ed Center. General meeting attendance credit towards membership will be given for any new members and guests who help out.
- •Steve Hansen reported that the Spring classes begin the first week of April and there are some classes that need students in order to reach minimum enrollment. Please let Steve know of interest in helping teach the Main Line School Night cabbing workshops.
- •Bill Frampton encouraged registration in the guest instructor classes in the hope to not have to cancel those courses.
- •Gary Cummings encouraged everyone to familiarize themselves with the details of the new mask directive.
- •Barry Messino reported that next week will be the first Gemarama meeting. Barry asked everyone to start thinking about donations for the grab bags, which are bags for the kids, which can include items such as small shells, small tumbled rocks, stickers, inexpensive jewelry items, arrowheads, etc. Dennis Coren congratulated Barry Messino and John Chickadel for achieving Journeyman scores in the Sphere class division in SKIP. He encouraged members to think about participating in the SKIP program.

Following the business meeting there was a video of a talk by Richard Freeman on the Jonas Mine Tourmaline Discovery, from the 2019 Dallas Symposium. In the talk, Freeman took us through what the tourmaline deposits must have looked like, and gave an in-depth look at the different Grandfather stones and their locations within the mine.

Our June dinner will be here before you know it! It's time to submit a cabochon or faceted gem (or one of each) for the Single Stone Exhibition. Any color, shape, or style is welcome. The submissions are evaluated solely on the merits of YOUR work; a number is submitted with your entry instead of your name, and you will be given individualized written feedback on your demonstrated skill and the quality of your work. No one sees the evaluation but you.

These cabochons or faceted gems can later be submitted to the SKIP program as well. Further information about SKIP appears on page 5 of this Bulletin.

To submit your cab, put it in a baggie labeled with your name and the name of the stone (picture jasper, red agate). Faceted gems should be placed in an appropriate container before being placed in a baggie; be sure to label it clearly and include the diagram used to cut the gem. The collection point is a plastic container in the lower right-hand drawer of the desk in the library at the Ed Center. Numbers will be assigned before the judges see them so they don't know who they are evaluating.

*This is going to be a big Silent Auction!* We have tools including a drill press and motors, three tables worth of slabs ranging from \$1 to \$20, some cabs, and some beading material. There are also two hand made display cabinets with 2 x 4 plexiglass sides....and much more!

## **HOW DOES THE SILENT AUCTION WORK?**

First, bring something you wish to donate to TLS: rough, slabs, cabs, cut stones, findings, finished jewelry, equipment, tools, supplies, books, or whatever (not junk). Fill out one of the auction forms on page 8 for each item and that's it! (If you don't know what to put down for the price, leave it blank; help will be available at the meeting.) If you have more than three items to donate, copy the auction forms; there also will be extra forms at the meeting.

Please remember, while you can look at things ahead of time, Silent Auction bidding begins only after the General Meeting is adjourned.

Here's how it works: When you see something you want, write your name and your bid on the item's slip; your bid must be just one increment over the last bid. If someone 'ups' your bid, you can fill in your next offer. When the table is closed, the last name on the list (the highest bid) gets to purchase the item for that price.

At the conclusion of the bidding, and all tables have been closed, bring all of your slips to the front, and your purchases will be tallied.

#### -From Frank Warner TLS History Series #17 Highlights, Part 5: 1985 - 1995

#### 1985

In July, Howard Freeman was awarded "Man of the Year" for outstanding service to the Eastern Federation and to TLS - a high honor for Howard as well as TLS.

Gemarama was held for the first time at the Robert C. Gauntlett Community Center in Newtown Square. Hurricane Gloria hit this area on show set-up day. Dealers were late and the rented tables couldn't get there at all! Bob Heyburn saved the day by finding a company that could supply tables immediately. There were 50 exhibitors plus lectures and a fashion show. Twenty-seven Associate Members signed up for the Skill Center. Attendance was 1312, up 250 over 1984 and the largest since 1980. It was a good year after all.

#### 1986

The general meeting place was changed to the Princeton Presbyterian Church in Springfield because the steep steps to the second floor of the Institute in Media were difficult for older members. TLS dues were raised from \$15 to \$20 per member, \$30 for family effective 1987 (and remained at this level until 2006). Three-minute biographical talks were begun at the General Meetings. The first casting and wax modeling classes were given at the Skill Center. The May program for the General Meeting was given by Ted Silverhand, a direct descendent of the Tuscarora Tribe. He presented the Club with a beaded pipe which is displayed with the Indian head intarsia. Pearls in oysters were introduced at Gemarama, \$5 an oyster. We sold findings and set the pearls in them for free.

A new Auxiliary status for spouses of members was added to the by-laws in December with all rights and benefits of membership except for the ability to hold office or to vote. Dues for Auxiliary members was set at \$10.

Financially the Society was doing well. TLS had a balance of \$25,934.96 at the end of November.

#### 1987

At this point in time there were no fees for TLS members to participate in Skill Center courses, seminars or other activities. In May, the Board decided that TLS Auxiliary members (spouses of TLS members) would be entitled to go to classes at the Skill Center without an additional fee. New name tags were designed and produced for TLS members.

#### 1988

A telephone was installed for the first time at the Skill Center. TLS again started looking for a larger place for the Skill Center. Patterns and materials for a TLS vest were made available by Betty Smith at the May meeting.

#### 1989

The General Meeting place was changed to The Springfield Municipal Building. A summer picnic at the Heyburn home included an old-fashioned hayride. In April, a cub scout troop came to the Skill Center on a field trip - junior member David Santucci demonstrated cabbing (with help of his dad, Peter).

#### 1990

An answering machine was installed at the Skill Center. Chesna Coren's fudge recipe was chosen in a contest. Fudge made by TLS members according to Chesna's recipe was sold at Gemarama.

In September, a registration form for classes appeared in the *Bulletin* for the first time.

#### 1991

The Skill Center was renamed the L. Howard Freeman Skill Center in memory of Howard who had been a driving force behind the success of the Skill Center and who passed away on May 14. In October, the Board approved a \$10 fee for members taking classes that use club equipment, and a \$5 fee if no equipment is used, in order to help provide funds for the replacement of worn equipment.

At the May meeting, President Shirley Heyburn asked members to be on the lookout for another location for our Skill Center. "We have outgrown our present one," she said.

This was the first year for an auction at Gemarama, held Saturday evening after the show closed. It was very successful and a lot of fun.

#### 1992

The Skill Center was remodeled. New benches were built to hold the grinding and polishing machines and lots of cleaning, painting, and reorganization took place.

#### 1993

#### 1994

Gemarama celebrated its 25th anniversary and pins were made to commemorate the event. Winter classes ran five weeks behind schedule because of the winter weather. A "big rain" had melted the "big snow" and left 2" to 3" of water in the Skill Center. Those coming for a Monday evening class found the problem and pitched in to clean up.

#### 1995

A needlepoint portrait of the TLS Indian made in 1977 by Maxine Grote was presented to the Society. The TLS Memorial Case was dedicated on September 17.

New mini display cases were made for members to use at Gemarama. Gemarama was held the first weekend in November for the first time at the new Penn State location. The show went well despite a blackout caused by a blown transformer on the first day.
