September's Program

The speaker for September will be renowned faceter and graduate gemologist Peter Torraca. Peter will be speaking about orienting rough for color. Peter got his start in the jewelry business in the 1980s and didn't take up faceting until 2007. His interest in faceting quickly became a passion and he focused on precision cutting, cutting to a much higher standard than typically seen for sale in retail.

Peter specializes in precision cutting, repair of gemstones, and recutting of gemstones. He often cuts calibrated gemstones, enabling his work to be set in standard settings while still maximizing weight and brilliance.

Peter's diploma from GIA for gemology enables him to not only identify the stones he comes across, but also to identify internal flaws and inclusions that must be avoided when cutting. He also uses his gemology knowledge to identify rough in the field in Africa.

Fall Classes Begin September 5, 2024

TLS Education Center 24 Upland Road Brookhaven, PA 19015

TLS offers classes to adults interested in pursuing lapidary and jewelry arts. No previous experience is needed unless a prerequisite is noted. In some courses and workshops there is an additional charge for supplies and equipment. Pricing for classes is listed for members (M) and non-members (NM). Membership requires completion of Beginning Cabochon or Faceting class, participation in two TLS monthly meetings and willingness to participate as a volunteer in TLS activities. Course details, including the required supply and tool lists for many classes, and our online registration system, may be found at https://www.lapidary.org/classes-fall-2024. Fees for supplies are payable to the instructors and may depend on the choice of materials.

Class Refund Policy: Some classes and many open shop sessions fill up rapidly and have extensive wait lists. If you must drop out of a class or open shop session, please do so as early as possible so others may be given the opportunity to enroll. Your courtesy in doing so will be appreciated. Also, if you believe you are ill, or becoming ill, we respectfully ask that you decline to attend. If you wish to withdraw from a class, workshop, or open shop session, you must notify the Registrar and instructor by email. When refunds are requested, we retain 10% of tuition as a processing fee. Tuition will be refunded 100% (minus the processing fee) if you withdraw before 7 days prior to the start date of the course, workshop, or open shop session. If you withdraw 7 to 3 days prior to the start date, tuition will be refunded 80% (minus the processing fee). There will be no refunds for withdrawals within 2 days of the start of the class, workshop, or open shop session. In the event of emergencies or other extenuating circumstances, TLS will consider making exceptions to this policy on a case-by-case basis. If such an event or circumstance occurs, please email the registrar with your inquiry and it will be reviewed as soon as possible.

Students are enrolled in the order that online payments or checks and registration forms are received. Please note: Checks for full tuition must accompany the registration form in order to reserve a spot in the class. (F24FT9-7) **Beginner Faceting Weekend Workshop**: (Twoday workshop, Saturday & Sunday, September 7 & 8) 9AM-5PM. Limit 7. For new students. Students will learn to facet cutting glass in one of the TLS Beginner patterns. Instructors: Steve Hansen and Karl Kobie. Tuition: NM\$130/M\$70. (F24BB9-14) **Glass Bead Making**: (Two-day workshop, Saturday & Sunday, September 14 & 15) 9AM-5PM. Limit 6. For beginners and those with some bead-making experience. Students will use a torch to make beads out of glass. This course satisfies the prerequisite for TLS Open Torch sessions. Instructors: Lisa Laffend and Zasha Morales José. Tuition: NM\$160/

M\$100.

(F24EL9-21) **Saw Piercing Plique-à-Jour**: (Two-day workshop, Saturday & Sunday, September 21 & 22) 10AM-5PM. Minimum 6, maximum 8. Plique-à-jour (French "open to the light") is a technique developed in 14th century France and Italy, creating a miniature stained glass effect. In this class you will learn one way to achieve this enamel technique by saw piercing your design in fine silver and then enameling the open cells. Experience working with a jeweler's saw is a plus. Guest Instructor: Joan Strott-Alvini (http://www.glassongold.com). Tuition: NM\$265/M\$205. Materials fee (payable to the instructor) is \$45.

(F24BG9-28) **Gem ID**: (Saturday September 28) 10AM-3PM. Limit 8. Beginner/Intermediate Level. In this workshop, students will be given a brief introduction to geologic processes that form our favorite faceted gemstones, followed by a discussion of mineral physical and optical properties that help us identify gemstones, and finally we will have a hands-on session using the most common diagnostic instruments to try to solve the mystery of the unknown gem. Students are encouraged to bring a faceted stone of their choice to identify. Instructor: John Chickadel. Tuition: NM\$60/M\$35.

(F24MC10-5) **Jewelry Investment and Casting**: (Two-day workshop, Saturday & Sunday, October 5 & 6) 9AM-4PM. Limit 8. Beginner/Intermediate level. This class will focus on vacuum investment and vacuum casting using the "Lost Wax" technique. Instructors: Dennis Coren and Don Schwarzkopf. Tuition: NM\$170/M\$110 (includes \$50 materials fee for metal, wax, casting investment, and supplies).

Students should bring the Super Glue bottle that has a brush; stones will be provided at no extra cost. Instructor: Kathy Statton. Tuition: NM \$60/M \$35 (F24OP9-15/F24OP10-13/F24OP11-10) **Sunday Opal Cutting Workshops**: (Three One-day workshops, Sunday, September 15, Sunday October 13, Sunday, November 10) 10AM-5PM. Limit 7. Prerequisite: One TLS Gateway (Beginning) Cabochon course. Opal cutting for current or prospective opal addicts. Facilitators: Steve Hansen and Anna Thompson. Tuition: NM\$60/M\$35 per day. Materials fee, payable to the instructor, tbd depending on materials used.

(F24IS10-26) **Making a Basket Setting**: (Two-day workshop, Saturday & Sunday, October 26 & 27) 10AM-5PM. Limit 10. Beginner/Intermediate level. In this two-day workshop, students will learn to create a traditional wire basket setting pendant for a round stone in sterling silver. They will then learn the basics of stone setting to finish the piece off with an 8mm CZ. Some soldering experience is highly recommended. Guest Instructor: Vi Hutchinson. Tuition: NM\$235/M\$175 (Note: Tuition includes a \$15 materials fee).

(F24GF11-9) **Introduction to Glass Fusing**: (Two-day workshop, Saturday & Sunday, November 9 & 10) 9AM- 5PM. Limit 6. Learn the fundamentals of fusing glass, including cutting glass, kiln schedules, and the tools and equipment used. Explore the use of sheet glass, stringer, and frit to make several projects, including small dishes, pendants, and ornaments. This class is for beginners. Instructors: Lynn Bibolet and Jody Shaw.

Tuition: NM\$150/M\$90.

(F24AS11-16) **Introduction to Chasing and Repousse Weekend Workshop**: (Two-day workshop, Saturday & Sunday, November 16 & 17) 10AM-4PM. Limit 4. This workshop will introduce concepts, tools, and methods of chasing and repousse (C&R). Consider a flat piece of metal: chasing yields a design on its side to be viewed, while repousse pushes out the material from the back to create visual depth in the finished piece. All working of the piece is done using steel punches and a hammer to move the metal to create the finished piece. Students will complete two pieces in the class using 2"x2" metal pieces – one with copper and one with sterling silver. A pitch bowl and set of basic C&R tools will be provided. Instructor: Ken Dahl. Tuition: NM\$120/M\$60. Materials fee (payable to the instructor) approximately \$20.

(F24AS11-16A) **Introduction to the Hydraulic Press**: (Saturday, November 16) 12-3pm. Limit 4. In this workshop, students will learn the basic operations of the electric hydraulic press. Techniques taught in this class will include how to use a pancake die, a silhouette die, and an impression die. Students who complete the class will end the day with components that can be used as elements in their jewelry designs. A materials kit will be provided. Instructor: Stacey Segal. Tuition: NM\$40/M\$20. Material fee (payable to the instructor) of \$15.

Silent Auction

The October 9, 2024 Silent Auction will be in person at the Springfield Township Municipal Building, 50 Powell Road, Springfield, PA. 

Call for Gemarama Single Stone Exhibition Submissions

Gemarama 2024 is just around the corner and the Single Stone exhibit will be on display throughout the show, on November 2nd and 3rd! We are inviting members and non-members to submit a cabochon and/or faceted stone to display in the Single Stone showcase. The Single Stone exhibition is a program that highlights stone cutting craftmanship. In addition to displaying the submitted stones in the Gemarama showcase, all participates will receive an award certificate and a technical feedback sheet for their submission.

This year's Gemarma theme is "Phenomenal Gems", which are stones that display specific optical effects that can appear to have almost magical interactions with light. These phenomena include adularescence, aventurescence, asterism, chatoyancy, color change, iridescence, labradorescence, play of color, tenebrescence, and ultraviolet tenebrescence. Stone

submissions for this exhibition do not have to match the theme, but the theme may act as inspiration for participants, if desired. Previous single stone submissions that displayed a couple of these "phenomenal" qualities are pictured here.

All submissions for the exhibition are due by Thursday, Oc-

Here are descriptions of competitions, judging, and awards. AFMS Uniform Rules will not be used in the evaluation of cases and the selection of awards. Material selection, craftsmanship, presentation, and showmanship are the key factors.

GROUND RULES FOR EXHIBITORS & AWARD SELECTION

JUDGING: Judging will take place prior to the opening of the show on Saturday; identifying labels will be added to the cases when judging is complete.

AWARD SELECTION: A committee of judges will evaluate all cases and select winners of the four category awards:

Most Educational (All educational exhibits are eligible.)

Best Theme Display - "PHENOMENAL GEMS" (All exhibits of theme material are eligible.)

Best Non-Member Display (Cases by non-members only are eligible.)

Best Small Case – 18" x 12" (Cases by TLS members only are eligible.).

Judging committee will select cases for Best in Show and Director's Award.

ELIGIBILITY FOR AWARDS: An exhibitor may win only one of the four category awards; all cases, including winners of category awards, are eligible for Best in Show or Director's Award. An exhibitor cannot receive an identical award two years in a row. For example, the winner in 2023 of the Educational Award is not eligible for the Educational Award in 2024. Certain TLS exhibits are not eligible for awards (Single Stone exhibition, Education Center display, Memorial cases, Intarsias, etc.).
