Beyond Beginner Silver with Marthe Roberts/Shea: Pocket Locket Class

Carry a photo of a loved one with you or give a photo of yourself to a loved one to wear.

Lockets have a solid place in history. They celebrate what it means to honor, remember, love and mourn. The Victorians would braid a lock of hair from a deceased loved one as a token of remembrance. Some lockets carry ashes while others carry tiny photographs people or pets.

No matter what they convey, these tiny pockets of memories can represent a part of your personal history.

In this class students will learn to make a small, patterned, locket with a "slip in" frame.

Skills required: Soldering and sawing for jewelry making.
